

Call for short talks

MDENet (www.mde-network.org), the expert network on model-driven engineering (MDE), is a network which aims to bring together the (UK and international) community of people interested in MDE – researchers developing new MDE tools and techniques, practitioners already using MDE, practitioners who want to learn more about MDE, students etc – to drive future research, offer training around MDE, and generally raise the awareness and impact of MDE.

On December 1 and 2, we will be hosting our 2nd Annual Symposium at King's College, in London. This free event will be an excellent opportunity for anybody (potentially) interested in MDE to learn more about it, meet members of the community, make new connections and explore potential new collaborations. There will be a range of keynote talks, industry sessions, seedcorn project talks, as well as hands-on tutorials and challenge talks.

Keynote speakers like Jan Peleska and Jean-Marc Jezequel have already been secured so, don't miss this chance to get involved.

If you would like to be an active party of this event, we are looking for short - 15 minutes - talks on one of these areas:

- (i) a tale from industry about how you have applied MDE and what the challenges and successes were;
- (ii) a talk on some MDE tooling or approach either developed by someone in industry or in academia;
- (iii) a challenge from industry or a non-MDE perspective that someone wants to pose to see if there are ideas for addressing this in an MDE way.

This is a great opportunity for a PhD student, postdoc, or team member to talk about their work in more detail – as it does not have to be novel research (it can be something already published somewhere) and exchange ideas with the community.
